WASHINGTON, D.C.—Tonya Galbraith, Town Manager of McCordsville, Indiana recently received the Credentialed Manager designation from ICMA, the premier local government leadership and management organization. Galbraith is one of more than 1,000 local government management professionals currently credentialed through the ICMA Voluntary Credentialing Program. She is one of three Credentialed Managers in Indiana.

To receive the prestigious ICMA credential, a member must have significant experience as a senior management executive in local government, have earned a degree, preferably in public administration or a related field, and demonstrated a commitment to high standards of integrity and to lifelong learning and professional development.
