Utility New Payment Policy

- Motion by Mr. Williams to recess the regular Town Council meeting and convene the Utility board. Strayer. 5-0
- Utility Department Supervisor Stephanie Crider stated there are several customers who are behind on their utility bills because of the COVID order by Governor Holcomb of no water shut offs. The customer who is at least 2 months behind will receive a letter stating they would automatically be enrolled in the 6-month payment plan. The customer would have to pay current bill plus pay the installment payment of past due fees. Public Works Committee recommended this installment plan. There are 56 accounts totally \$15993.68 in arrears.

Patch Development Request

- Pat Chittenden with Patch Development a local real estate developer. The majority of what we do is industrial development.
- We have working with Mr Fisher on a parcel about approximately 75 acres on the north side of 500. We are asking the Town Council to consider tax abatement for the property.
- Randy Sorrell from the Hancock County Redevelopment Commission stated spec buildings with tax abatement lowers rent for tenants. Tenants shop lease rates and lower rates would attract more developments.
- Mr. Longman stated tax abatement would be listed in both the economic revitalization area and economic development plan.

Project Jarasco/Southwark Metals

- Jacob Everett from McGuire Sponsel stated there were no major changes in the presentation
 from the last Town Council meeting except Southwark had agreed to one road cut and would be
 happy to work with the owner for the property to the north. Utility improvement credit was off
 the table. There would be a 20-foot buffer yard on the north end with evergreen trees.
- Southwark would like to move forward with the formal process for tax abatement.
- The Town is looking at another road, currently names 550 N.
- Southwark requests for permitting fees from the Town be waived.
- Public comments
 - o Kurt Swadener stated he was a resident in Woodhaven. He went to Southwark's business location to take pictures. There was a bunch of junk; blue frames and trash laying around. Mr. Swadener was concerned about the road cut in the curve and sight lines. He also asked how high the buffer would be and how large the evergreen trees would be. He went to the location 3 different times and the doors were opened every time.
 - O Ms. Emma Adlam with Baker Tilly stated with the proposed tax abatement schedule Southwark would save approximately \$2,450,000 over the 10 years. Southwark would still be paying about \$3 million annually during the tax abatement. Southwark's property liability would be approximately 550,000 annually after the 10 years of the tax abatement.
 - AJ Kalb stated he is a resident of Woodhaven. Mr. Kalb would like to see a fence on top
 of the buffer yard. He also asked how this tax abatement schedule aligned with what
 the County was doing for tax abatement.
 - Corey asked if the current facility had air conditioning, if there was welding in the plant, and what road improvements would be done to 600 N for the road cut.
- Mr. Morelock stated the first step in the process would be a Declaratory Resolution, have a public hearing, and then approve a confirmatory resolution.

- Mr. Crum stated when McCordsville Corner Shoppes was originally platted it had 3 lots. Revel & Underwood would like to re-plat and divide one lot into two. Mr. Crum stated it has gone through Plan Commission and Technical Advisory Committee and had received approval.
